SUMMARY OF MARKET ACTIVITY AND OUTLOOK

In April, the Nigerian Stock Market continued to rally, on the back of reduced selling pressure from offshore investors. The Fund closed with allocations of 65% and 35% to Equities and Money Market Instruments. The Fund returned 7.84%, compared with 8.08% for the index, despite the 35% underweight exposure to equities. The 5-year annualised volatilities for the Fund and Benchmark decreased from 17.20% and 22.60%, in March, to 17.00% and 22.50%, in April, respectively.

Inflation data released by Nigeria's National Bureau of Statistics showed that Headline Consumer Price Index rose by 12.26% y/y in March 2020, compared with 12.20% in the previous month. Month-on-month, the Headline index increased by 0.84% in March, versus 0.79% previously. Core inflation, which excludes the prices of volatile food produce, increased by 0.30% in March, to 9.73% y/y. Also, Food inflation rose from 14.90% in the previous month, to 14.98% y/y. In the domestic sovereign bond market, yields decreased across most maturities. The yield on the 3-year government bond decreased by 177 basis points, to 5.76%, whilst that on the 20-year bond fell by 167 basis points, to 11.30%. The DMO reopened the FGN bonds 12.75% Apr 2023s, 12.50% Mar 2035s and 12.98% Mar 2050s. The bonds were oversubscribed with bid-to-cover ratios of 1.65 times, 1.49 times, and 2.21 times, respectively. In the previous month, bid-to-cover ratios for the 5-year, 15-year, and 30-year FGN Bonds were 4.24 times, 3.45 times and 3.64 times, respectively.

Internationally, the Emerging Markets index increased by 8.54%. Likewise, the Developed Markets index rose by 11.73%.






